The Process for an Election of a Bishop

At this year's synod assembly, which will be held at the Gateway Convention Center, Collinsville, IL, June 1-3, 2017, voting members will participate in the election of a bishop. The Rev. Dr. Wyvetta Bullock, ELCA representative, will preside over the bishop election process.

Only voting members present at the assembly may nominate an individual for the Office of Bishop. Nominees for the Office of Bishop are limited to those ordained persons included on the ELCA roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament. The term of the Office of Bishop is for six years. The term for the person elected in 2017 will continue into the year 2023. Per constitution +S9.12, a background check and screening shall be required and completed for the bishop-elect as soon as practical after his/her election.

An ecclesiastical ballot is the process used to elect a bishop. The process is as follows:

1. On the first ballot, voting members may write the name of any ordained pastor currently included on the ELCA roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament. 3/4 legal votes cast are needed for election. If no one is elected, this is the nominating ballot and all eligible nominees are considered.
2. Ballot 2 is limited to those listed on the nominations ballot who did not withdraw their name, plus ties. 3/4 legal votes cast are still needed for election.
3. Ballot 3 is limited to the seven highest nominees, plus ties. 2/3 legal votes cast are needed for election.
4. Ballot 4 is limited to the three highest nominees, plus ties. 60% of legal votes cast are needed for election.
5. Ballot 5 is limited to the two highest nominees. 50% + 1 legal votes are needed for election.

Please note: To facilitate the Nominating Ballot for Bishop, registration will close at 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 1, and will re-start once the first ballot is completed. Voting members are encouraged to come to the assembly early in order to complete the registration process prior to the first ballot.

In their own words...



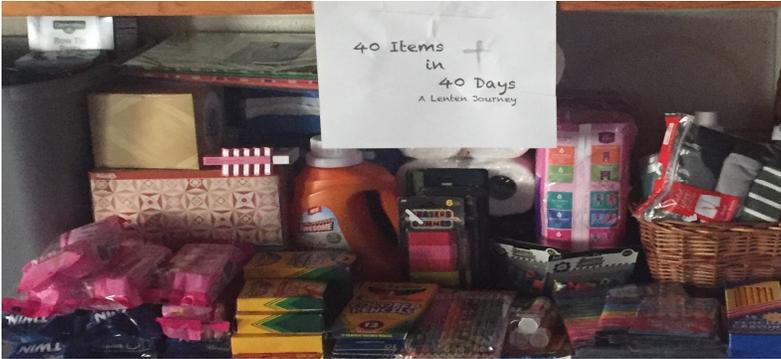

St. John, Cullom and St. Paul, Chatsworth Conduct "40 Items in 40 Days" Campaign

Members of St. John, Cullom and St. Paul, Chatsworth went beyond the usual "giving up something for Lent", as they invited members to embark on a "40 Items in 40 Days" campaign to collect items for the Chatsworth After-School program, the Cullom Food Pantry and the Tri-Point Schools (in which 63% of the student body is at or below the poverty line).

One of the things that contributed to the effectiveness of the in-gathering was that all three organizations were contacted in advance and congregational members could select preferred items from a wish list that had been developed.
